# **Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice**

The Criminal Justice bachelor's degree program is designed for undergraduate students with a strong interest in understanding how agencies and institutions function as part of the criminal justice system. Students will learn about different ideas of justice and come to understand the impact the justice system has on lives of individuals and communities through law enforcement, the courts, and corrections. In addition to understanding the historical context that shaped current agencies and institutions, students will have the opportunity to engage timely topics like constitutional rights, police use of force, collaboration with tribal nations, alternatives to incarceration, and the use of evidence-based practices. Graduates will be well positioned for careers in law enforcement, courts administration, policy analysis, law, and intelligence.

## **Degree Requirements**

The **BS** in **Criminal Justice** has the following degree requirements in addition to the statewide general education requirements:

- 120 (minimum) total credit hours
- 45 (minimum) upper-division credit hours (these may include the following)
- 6-8 BS requirement credit hours\*
- 18 criminal justice core credits hours
- 12 concentration credit hours
- 3 capstone credit hours

\*BS requirements include an additional natural science course and additional quantitative reasoning course above and beyond the statewide general education requirements.

A 2.0 minimum grade-point average for all junior/senior courses (300+) in the major and concentration.
